
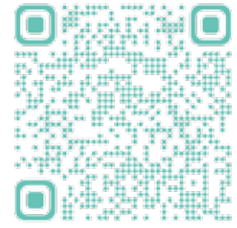

QUICK GUIDELINES

Assessment for New and Returning Students:

Limited time offer: From February 1 to March 31, 2024, students who complete assessment and enrolls in the Easter Intensive Program will receive the paid assessment fee as credit for tuition deduction upon enrollment.

New or returning* students need to be assessed before any enrollment. The purpose of the assessment is to allow our teachers to assess a student's current academic abilities and give their professional recommendations on which programs will be best suited for their needs. *Returning Capstone students are students who have not attended any course for the past six months.

For assessment booking, you may call us at 2893 6060 to schedule the assessment and/or the 15-min interview for G7-12 Christmas Debate Program.

(Option 1) To facilitate the assessment process for your child, the comprehensive written assessment will be done in our center and it will take around 1 hour for G1-6 and 2 hours for G7-12. Please also note that there will be a **\$300 assessment fee** for each student and an assessment report will be provided along with the course recommendations.

Assessment Fee for comprehensive written assessment with report:

1. **An assessment fee of \$300** must be collected at the time of the assessment placement test; otherwise, assessment will not be arranged and processed.
2. The fee paid for the assessment is **NOT refundable or transferable**.
3. Capstone will provide an assessment report of each student by email within 10 days. A hard copy will be available upon request and to be collected at our center.
4. The assessment fee paid can be used in settling part of the registration fee (see attached Terms and Conditions) so long as the student enrolls in a course within 14 days of receiving the assessment's results.

(Option 2) While we understand if your child is not available to come in to our center to take the comprehensive written assessment, you may opt to do the online submission and submit two writing sample requirements to receive course recommendations for the program placement.

Primary G1 to G6 Students

- Two recent writing samples (one fiction and one non-fiction) that are no older than two months
- Writing samples should be compositions and not "question and answer" type exercises.

Secondary G7 to G12 Students

- Two recent writing samples from different genres (e.g. Persuasive and Descriptive) that are no older than two months
- Writing samples should be at least 200 words in length.

Special Offers for 2024 Easter Intensive Program

All discounts are only applicable to students who enroll in our Easter Intensive Program.

Early Bird discount: Students who enroll and pay on or before March 2, 2024 will receive a \$300 discount.

Multi-Course discount: Multi-Course discount for second course or above will receive a \$300 discount on their tuition and course fees. *This discount cannot be used in conjunction with other discount offers and with any deductions.*

Sibling Discount: Siblings who enrolls in the Easter Intensive Program concurrently will receive a maximum up to \$300 discount from the course enrolled for a family.

Note: Sibling Discounts will be forfeited in the case that either one of the sibling's courses is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment to the class.

Refer-A-Friend for Easter Intensive Program:

Referrers Rewards:

Earn rewards credit when your friends successfully complete the Intensive Program. For every friend you refer to our Easter Intensive Program, you and your friend will each receive \$200 off your tuition fees.

The referrer rewards will be applied to your child's next tuition invoice. The rewards credit will be available at the end of the intensive Program and eligible students will be notified by email to avail their rewards. All credits must be availed and used on or before the end of the 2023-2024 Academic Year (August 2024).

Referee Discount:

*Referee students should be NEW students to Capstone, and should not have attended any course at Capstone before.

The referred new student* will receive an instant of \$200 discount when he/she enrolls in an Easter Intensive course.

Easter Intensive Course Completion:

Intensive Course Completion Special Offer: Registration Fee waiver for enrollment in the Academic Enrichment Program (On-going) Completion of Intensive Program Special Offer: After completion of any Intensive course, Capstone will waive the registration fee when the student is immediately enrolled in the Academic Enrichment (on-going) program.

Notes:

- This offer is only applicable for enrollment within 4 weeks of Intensive course completion. Offer cannot be applied to a previous enrollment period.
- This offer is only applicable to classes with available seats.
- Upon course confirmation, tuition fee must be paid within 7 days in order to secure the seat in the course.

Enrollment Terms and Conditions for 2024 Easter Intensive Courses

1. Registration must be made on the Registration Form provided and returned to us no less than 7 days before the course commencement date with full fee. Payment can be made by cash, EPS, or crossed cheque payable to CAPSTONE PREP EDUCATION CENTER. Cheque payment is accepted subject to clearance. Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.
2. Upon full payment, applications are processed on a first-come-first-served basis. Acceptance is subject to the discretion of Capstone.
3. Please confirm your schedules before enrolling as fees, once paid, are non-refundable and non-transferable. For all classes, if student is absent for a class due to sickness or other personal reasons, no refunds and no make up class will be provided.
4. For in-person courses: because of the COVID-19 situation, sessions may sometimes be switched from in-person to online learning due to safety concerns. In such circumstances: (1) the student is expected to attend at the same session but through online means, (2) tuition will not be adjusted or otherwise compensated for any sessions that were converted from in-person to online due to the above circumstances.
5. A formal assessment is conducted for all new students and former Capstone students (who have not attended any course for the past six months) to ensure he/she will be placed in the class best suited to their learning style and maturity level.
6. A minimum of 4 students are required for a course to run as scheduled. Capstone reserves the right to cancel a course if enrollment is insufficient. In such case, students will be required to transfer to another scheduled course.
7. Capstone reserves the right to substitute instructors and to make changes to the content and class schedule if necessary without prior notice.
8. Capstone reserves the right to change the terms & conditions without prior notice. In case of any dispute arising from the program, the decision of Capstone shall be final.
9. Inclement Weather
 - a. All classes will be held as scheduled during Signal No. 1 or 3 or Amber Alerts or Yellow/Red Warning unless otherwise announced by Capstone.
 - b. Before classes commence, if the Observatory announces that the warning for "Black Rainstorm" is in force or Typhoon Signal No. 8 or higher will be hoisted within 2 hours, no classes will be held. If these weather signals are lowered during the day, all classes will resume three hours after the official announcement by the HK Observatory. We regret that we cannot arrange replacement classes nor refunds for these enforced closures.
 - c. When Typhoon Signal No. 8 or above is in force during classes, all classes will be dismissed immediately, no replacement classes nor refund will be arranged. When Black Rainstorm warning is in force during classes, all classes will be held as scheduled.
10. Any information we collect from you will be used for student records and other relevant or related purposes by Capstone and its staff for administration, programming and emergencies only. All information will be kept confidential.
11. Capstone may, from time to time, use student photos, videos, or works (including activities inside and outside of the classroom) for Capstone course and marketing promotions such as its brochure, website or publications.

Refund Policies and Procedures

A. Refund Policies:

1. In case of school closure prior to the commencement of a course, our school will refund (in full) the course fee collected stated on the tuition invoice.
2. If a course cannot be operated according to the arrangements specified in the fee receipts and students decline the revised arrangements offered by our school, our school will refund in full or on a pro-rata basis of the course fee collected. The request for refund must be through email to info@capstoneprep.com and will be processed within a month after the request date.
3. In case of cessation of a course after its commencement, our school will refund the course fee collected on a pro-rata basis as soon as possible and in any event no later than one month after the cessation of the course.

B. Refund Procedures:

1. Our School will confirm the refund arrangement either over the telephone or in writing.
2. Our School will refund in accordance with the above policies.
3. When processing the refund, Capstone will not take away the original fee receipts. Acknowledgement on the receipt of the refund must be confirmed by the signature of the parent or legal guardian.
4. Our School will pay the refund by cheque.



G1-2 Novel Study: Reading Narrative Elements

This Easter, students will read *Snot Stew* by Bill Wallace. By applying their critical thinking skills and practising close-reading, students will explore different aspects of a piece of narrative writing, from the setting, to the characters, to the plot. Their reading comprehension skills will be put to the test as they become experts in a book in just a few days. By the end of the course, students will have completed a book report about the story.

In this course, students will...

- Read a large amount in close detail
- Develop their understanding of different parts of a narrative
- Create their own writing piece reporting on the story

G1-2 Research and Present: Homes for the World

This course will see students embark on a four-stage project to learn how to research, design, test, and present their own creation. Their task this Easter is to design a home fit for the Amazon Rainforest, by carefully considering climate limitations, extreme weather events, and the comfort and functionality of a home. Their reading, writing, and speaking skills will be tested throughout different stages of the project, and by the end of the course they will present their home design to their peers.

In this course, students will...

- Learn how different climates lead to different house designs
- Be prepared to make changes when introduced to new information
- Practise public speaking skills

G3-4 Writing & Grammar: Write the Right Way

This writing and grammar course focuses on the application of grammar so students can see the purpose and difference in writing with correct grammar. The course centres around modal verbs and conditional types 0 to 4, in which students will learn, practice and apply them. Extreme weather is the theme to enable students to apply the taught grammar skills in writing letters, plans, and suggestions.

- Understand the usage of modal verbs
- Differentiate between all four types of conditionals
- Apply grammar skills in writing

G3-4 Critical Thinking: My Rights! Your Rights!

This critical thinking course focuses on problem-solving by learning and practising different strategies to understand, analyse and think about problems to come up with plausible solutions. Students will also uncover their rights as children. This course will cover parts of the Children's Rights by UNICEF, namely Rights to Healthy Food, Rights to Education, Rights to Protection, and Rights to Participation. At the end of the course, each student will have a presentation on their solution to a problem.

In this course, students will...

- Learn the techniques to understand problems and solve problems
- Compare and contrast information and experience
- Synthesise information to present ideas and findings
- Present their solution

G3-4 Public Speaking and Debate I: Pokemon Whoa! Intergenerational Cultural Debates

In 1996, the Pokemon Craze was unleashed, capturing the hearts and minds of countless children around the world. Flash forward to 2024 and many of those kids are now parents of the next generation of Pokemon fanatics. In this course, students will draw upon their vast knowledge of All Things Pokemon as they gain more exposure to understanding different perspectives. In other words, students will learn that older Pokemon lovers may look at the same game in a very different way. Taking this into account, they will develop thoughtful arguments that synthesize these varying viewpoints and deliver forceful speeches that will serve as excellent practice for future presentations and debates. ***Students interested in joining this intensive program must first complete an interview with our debating instructor.***

In this course, students will...

- Learn how to structure their arguments and present these to adults who have different perspectives from them.
- Analyze products and situations for similarities and alternatives to prove the superiority of their argument.
- Predict and consider short- and long-term consequences of decisions to persuade listeners to ideal futures.

G5-6 Aspiring Writers: In the Beginning: Writing and Analyzing Origin Myths

In this course, students will improve their critical reading and writing skills by looking at the ways people throughout history have envisioned the beginning of the world. Students will have the opportunity to read a variety of origin myths from five different continents and compare and contrast the ways vastly different cultures have considered this one topic. In addition to learning about this significant cultural history, students will also analyse these myths based on their story structure and use of symbolism and personification. Throughout the course, students will be working on applying these ideas to an origin story of their own creation, which they will complete by the end of the course.

In this course, students will...

- Read origin myths from a variety of cultures
- Learn how to analyze symbolism and personification
- Write their own origin myth using the skills they learn in the course

G5-6 Reading & Vocab: Overlooked Heroes

This Easter, students will deepen their lexical abilities by examining works about important, but often overlooked, heroes in history. Each class, students will elevate their reading comprehension abilities by learning to analyze what they read with precision and rigor. Additionally, students will hone their verbal reasoning skills, and will dissect the meaning of texts by making logical and textual inferences - all of which will help them to grow into active and hands-on readers!

In this course, students will...

- Actively engage with a variety of texts by parsing definitions and annotating
- Draw on information from a variety of sources (both print and digital) in order to demonstrate the ability to locate and answer questions quickly
- Analyze and explain how an author uses specific vocabulary words to achieve their writing objectives

G5-6 Public Speaking and Debate I: It's Not Personal: Defending the "Bad Guys"

For aspiring debaters, defending ideas and people that they personally dislike is one of the most challenging adjustments they will have to make. As unpleasant as it may be at times, it is extremely important for a budding debater's development as it trains them to become more open-minded through rigorous analysis of different perspectives. In this course, young students will advocate for ideas, individuals, and groups that are often looked upon unfavorably. In the process, they will learn to set aside their personal feelings while sticking to their principles, thereby giving them an early introduction to the worlds of competitive debate and law. **Students interested in joining this intensive program must first complete an interview with our debating instructor.**

In this course, students will...

- Advocate for clients' rights and innocence in disputed situations.
- Analyze stakeholders wants and needs to achieve compromises.
- Develop and deliver effective arguments.

- Actively develop their arguments and make them persuasive
- Use facts and examples effectively in the context of debate
- Improve their ability to compare and weigh ideas
