
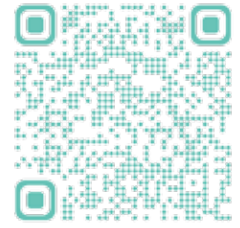

QUICK GUIDELINES

Assessment for New and Returning Students:

Limited time offer: From February 1- March 31, 2024, students who complete assessment and enrolls in the Easter Intensive Program will receive the paid assessment fee as credit for tuition deduction upon enrollment.

New or returning* students need to be assessed before any enrollment. The purpose of the assessment is to allow our teachers to assess a student's current academic abilities and give their professional recommendations on which programs will be best suited for their needs. *Returning Capstone students are students who have not attended any course for the past six months.

For assessment booking, you may call us at 2893 6060 to schedule the assessment and/or the 15-min interview for G7-12 Christmas Debate Program.

(Option 1) To facilitate the assessment process for your child, the comprehensive written assessment will be done in our center and it will take around 1 hour for G1-6 and 2 hours for G7-12. Please also note that there will be a **\$300 assessment fee** for each student and an assessment report will be provided along with the course recommendations.

Assessment Fee for comprehensive written assessment with report:

1. **An assessment fee of \$300** must be collected at the time of the assessment placement test; otherwise, assessment will not be arranged and processed.
2. The fee paid for the assessment is **NOT refundable or transferable**.
3. Capstone will provide an assessment report of each student by email within 10 days. A hard copy will be available upon request and to be collected at our center.
4. The assessment fee paid can be used in settling part of the registration fee (see attached Terms and Conditions) so long as the student enrolls in a course within 14 days of receiving the assessment's results.

(Option 2) While we understand if your child is not available to come in to our center to take the comprehensive written assessment, you may opt to do the online submission and submit two writing sample requirements to receive course recommendations for the program placement.

Primary G1 to G6 Students

- Two recent writing samples (one fiction and one non-fiction) that are no older than two months
- Writing samples should be compositions and not "question and answer" type exercises.

Secondary G7 to G12 Students

- Two recent writing samples from different genres (e.g. Persuasive and Descriptive) that are no older than two months
- Writing samples should be at least 200 words in length.

Special Offers for 2024 Easter Intensive Program

All discounts are only applicable to students who enroll in our Easter Intensive Program.

Early Bird discount: Students who enroll and pay on or before March 2, 2024 will receive a \$300 discount.

Multi-Course discount: Multi-Course discount for second course or above will receive a \$300 discount on their tuition and course fees. *This discount cannot be used in conjunction with other discount offers and with any deductions.*

Sibling Discount: Siblings who enrolls in the Easter Intensive Program concurrently will receive a maximum up to \$300 discount from the course enrolled for a family.

Note: Sibling Discounts will be forfeited in the case that either one of the sibling's courses is cancelled due to insufficient enrollment to the class.

Refer-A-Friend for Easter Intensive Program:

Referrers Rewards:

Earn rewards credit when your friends successfully complete the Intensive Program. For every friend you refer to our Easter Intensive Program, you and your friend will each receive \$200 off your tuition fees.

The referrer rewards will be applied to your child's next tuition invoice. The rewards credit will be available at the end of the intensive Program and eligible students will be notified by email to avail their rewards. All credits must be availed and used on or before the end of the 2023-2024 Academic Year (August 2024).

Referee Discount:

*Referee students should be NEW students to Capstone, and should not have attended any course at Capstone before.

The referred new student* will receive an instant of \$200 discount when he/she enrolls in an Easter Intensive course.

Easter Intensive Course Completion:

Intensive Course Completion Special Offer: Registration Fee waiver for enrollment in the Academic Enrichment Program (On-going) Completion of Intensive Program Special Offer: After completion of any Intensive course, Capstone will waive the registration fee when the student is immediately enrolled in the Academic Enrichment (on-going) program.

Notes:

- This offer is only applicable for enrollment within 4 weeks of Intensive course completion. Offer cannot be applied to a previous enrollment period.
- This offer is only applicable to classes with available seats.
- Upon course confirmation, tuition fee must be paid within 7 days in order to secure the seat in the course.

Enrollment Terms and Conditions for 2024 Easter Intensive Courses

1. Registration must be made on the Registration Form provided and returned to us no less than 7 days before the course commencement date with full fee. Payment can be made by cash, EPS, or crossed cheque payable to CAPSTONE PREP EDUCATION CENTER. Cheque payment is accepted subject to clearance. Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.
2. Upon full payment, applications are processed on a first-come-first-served basis. Acceptance is subject to the discretion of Capstone.
3. Please confirm your schedules before enrolling as fees, once paid, are non-refundable and non-transferable. For all classes, if student is absent for a class due to sickness or other personal reasons, no refunds and no make up class will be provided.
4. For in-person courses: because of the COVID-19 situation, sessions may sometimes be switched from in-person to online learning due to safety concerns. In such circumstances: (1) the student is expected to attend at the same session but through online means, (2) tuition will not be adjusted or otherwise compensated for any sessions that were converted from in-person to online due to the above circumstances.
5. A formal assessment is conducted for all new students and former Capstone students (who have not attended any course for the past six months) to ensure he/she will be placed in the class best suited to their learning style and maturity level.
6. A minimum of 4 students are required for a course to run as scheduled. Capstone reserves the right to cancel a course if enrollment is insufficient. In such case, students will be required to transfer to another scheduled course.
7. Capstone reserves the right to substitute instructors and to make changes to the content and class schedule if necessary without prior notice.
8. Capstone reserves the right to change the terms & conditions without prior notice. In case of any dispute arising from the program, the decision of Capstone shall be final.
9. Inclement Weather
 - a. All classes will be held as scheduled during Signal No. 1 or 3 or Amber Alerts or Yellow/Red Warning unless otherwise announced by Capstone.
 - b. Before classes commence, if the Observatory announces that the warning for "Black Rainstorm" is in force or Typhoon Signal No. 8 or higher will be hoisted within 2 hours, no classes will be held. If these weather signals are lowered during the day, all classes will resume three hours after the official announcement by the HK Observatory. We regret that we cannot arrange replacement classes nor refunds for these enforced closures.
 - c. When Typhoon Signal No. 8 or above is in force during classes, all classes will be dismissed immediately, no replacement classes nor refund will be arranged. When Black Rainstorm warning is in force during classes, all classes will be held as scheduled.
10. Any information we collect from you will be used for student records and other relevant or related purposes by Capstone and its staff for administration, programming and emergencies only. All information will be kept confidential.
11. Capstone may, from time to time, use student photos, videos, or works (including activities inside and outside of the classroom) for Capstone course and marketing promotions such as its brochure, website or publications.

Refund Policies and Procedures

A. Refund Policies:

1. In case of school closure prior to the commencement of a course, our school will refund (in full) the course fee collected stated on the tuition invoice.
2. If a course cannot be operated according to the arrangements specified in the fee receipts and students decline the revised arrangements offered by our school, our school will refund in full or on a pro-rata basis of the course fee collected. The request for refund must be through email to info@capstoneprep.com and will be processed within a month after the request date.
3. In case of cessation of a course after its commencement, our school will refund the course fee collected on a pro-rata basis as soon as possible and in any event no later than one month after the cessation of the course.

B. Refund Procedures:

1. Our School will confirm the refund arrangement either over the telephone or in writing.
2. Our School will refund in accordance with the above policies.
3. When processing the refund, Capstone will not take away the original fee receipts. Acknowledgement on the receipt of the refund must be confirmed by the signature of the parent or legal guardian.

G7-8 The Trigonometry Masterclass: Unlocking the Secrets of Mathematical Success

This trigonometry course is often considered a 'gateway' course because its content is necessary for further study in upper level mathematics such as IB Maths Analysis and Approaches, AP Calculus AB/BC, and A Level Mathematics. This course introduces students to the fundamental concepts and application of trigonometry. Students will learn about the basic trigonometric functions. Topics covered include:

- Introduction to Trigonometric Ratio
- Solving Right Triangles
- Trigonometric Functions, Identities, and Ratios of Special Angles
- Problem-Solving and Applications
- Trigonometric Inverses
- Law of sine and law of cosine

G7-9 Academic Writing: Beyond Dictionaries: Skills for Learning and Using New Vocabulary

In this course, students will be asked to challenge themselves to understand vocabulary that's new to them without constantly referencing a dictionary. We will learn key skills around using context and morphemes that help students logically decode what a word means in a way that helps them understand the words on a deeper level. We will then use these skills through reading a variety of historical-oriented stories with challenging vocabulary and discussing both their simple and complex meanings. Finally, students will be tasked with showing their true mastery of these new vocabulary words by using them in their own writing project that they will work on throughout the course.

In this course, students will...

- Learn how to use context and morphemes to understand new vocabulary
- Read a variety of challenging stories for both comprehension and analysis
- Write their own narrative work using vocabulary that they learn throughout the course.

G7-9 Academic Writing: Critique and Analyze: Mastering Persuasive Techniques

This course aims to equip students with the skills and strategies necessary to become influential literary critics, analyzing and evaluating works of fiction, poetry, film, or any other literary publication and creative medium. Students will learn to express their opinions effectively, supported by workable reasons and relevant textual evidence with proper in-text citation. Students will analyze the strengths and weaknesses of a literary work and explore its social or historical significance. By the end of the course, students will have mastered the art of impactful critical analysis and persuasion, skills directly applicable to future school assignments or exams related to literary analysis, literary criticism, journalism, academic reviews, and other types of persuasive writing.

In this course, students will...

- Read, annotate, question, discuss, and research about the text to brainstorm a well-constructed thesis that conveys a clear opinion and supporting reasons
- Outline and draft a literary criticism that clearly conveys the purpose and intent of a literary work, examine how the structure and language of the text convey its meaning, offer an in-depth critical analysis by explaining the significance of each part of the text, and assess its value
- Complete their literary criticism by revising and editing thoroughly, and finally present their findings to the class

G9+ Decoding Literature: Effective Analytical Writing and Presentation

This intensive course is perfect for students placed into Academic Writing III, Academic Writing III+, WDT, or who are currently in grade 9 or above. The skills taught in this course will be directly applicable to assessments in IB Literature, A-level English, and any other English literature courses at the high school level. In this course, students will learn to approach literary work systematically by examining its literary elements. Students will read and annotate literature while aiming to answer a literary question. Then, students will formulate a thesis and write a literary analysis in response to their discussion question. Lastly, students will present their findings about their chosen literary piece and evaluate one another based on a rubric. By the end of this course, students will gain a thorough understanding of how to write a literary analysis.

In this course, students will...

- Interpret and analyze poetry or fiction to provide further insight or an interesting perspective.
- Study and evaluate the use of literary devices such as mood, tone, imagery, context, theme, diction, form, rhyme, rhythm, alliteration, and figurative language.
- Present on the literary topic of their choice, demonstrating in-depth knowledge of the selected literary work and effective public speaking skills such as eye contact, gesture, and appropriate use of visual aids.

G7-9 Critical Thinking: Mysterious Memory: Decoding How We Understand the Past

This course will prompt students to examine the ways in which individuals and society remember and interpret the past, and the potential for both constructive and harmful applications of these memories. By exploring the fragility of memory and its susceptibility to manipulation, students will develop their critical thinking skills. They will analyze the perspectives of different stakeholders involved and cultivate essential public speaking skills, enabling them to effectively communicate their ideas through persuasive speeches and informal debates.

In this course, students will...

- Explore complex case studies related to the subject of memory
- Participate in facilitated discussions that encourage them to consider multiple viewpoints
- Enhance their critical reading abilities by analyzing challenging texts

G7-9 Critical Thinking: War - What Is It Good For? Challenges of Justice, Conflict & Peace

This course will stimulate students' critical thinking by exposing them to complex scenarios and thought-provoking questions about justice, conflict, and peace. Through case studies about historical and ongoing conflicts, students will explore the causes of war, the principles that govern warfare, and the key actors that jeopardize stability and peace. Additionally, students will engage in role-playing exercises, assuming the roles of international lawyers and politicians, to enhance their proficiency in articulating persuasive arguments. Consequently, this intensive course will challenge students to further develop both their critical thinking and public speaking skills.

In this course, students will...

- Conduct stakeholder analysis to explore situation from various perspectives
- Enhance their critical reading abilities through facilitated discussions
- Utilize their analysis by presenting their findings and engaging in debates

G7-9 Public Speaking and Debate I: The Game is On: Debating Sports

This Easter, students will learn to combine their interest in sports with public speaking and debating skills. Students will start with an engaging discussion comparing and connecting sports and academia. The course will further provoke discussion about the sports and physical fitness, ethics and fairness in competitive sports and current and future developments in the rapidly evolving world of esports and gaming. The course challenges them to brainstorm ideas, form opinions, articulate their perspectives and engage in intellectual discourse. **Students interested in joining this intensive program must first complete an interview with our debating instructor, or they must be enrolled in our introductory debate courses.**

In this course, students will...

- Learn to creatively and effectively develop ideas and opinions.
- Learn to present arguments logically for a range of situations.
- Learn how to respond and counter opposing arguments in a structured way.

G7-12 Public Speaking and Debate II: Behind the Screen: Debating the Media

This program is designed for debaters with experience looking to level up their knowledge and skills. Students will dive into the nature of media, exploring its role and influence in society. They will examine the tensions between free press and societal responsibility; the balance between public interest and privacy; and the ethical considerations of reporting. Through dissecting topics like news integrity, social media's impact on public opinion, and the responsibilities of popular media, students will scrutinise the extent of media freedom – contemplating when and why it should be checked. During each lesson, students will get to practise debate competitively in order to apply all of their newly found knowledge, and receive personalised feedback. **Students interested in joining this intensive program must first complete an interview with our debating instructor, or they must be enrolled in our intermediate debate courses.**

In this course, students will...

- Discover and understand what the media is, and how it has changed per the advent of the internet.
- Gain insight into the concept of responsibility and information amongst a network of stakeholders.
- Fashion cogent and compelling argumentation with an awareness of global issues, affairs, and events.
