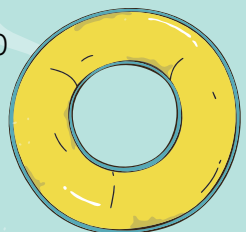

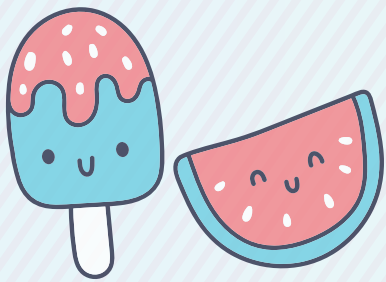

Submit **TWO writing samples** to receive course recommendations for the summer program placement. Please refer to the details below:

Upon submitting your writing samples, please also indicate your preferred day and time for the online interview or you may call us at 2893 6060 to schedule the 15-min interview for G5-12 Summer Debate Program. We will try our best to accommodate your preferences.

### Incoming Primary G1 to G6 Students

- Two recent writing samples (one fiction and one non-fiction) that are no older than two months.
- Writing samples should be compositions and not "question and answer" type exercises.

### Incoming Secondary G7 to G12 Students

- Two recent writing samples from different genres (e.g. Persuasive and Descriptive) that are no older than two months
- Writing samples should be at least 200 words in length

**Comprehensive written assessment is also available. Please contact us for details.**

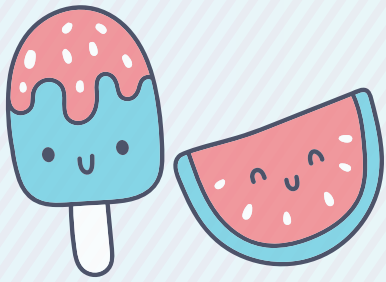

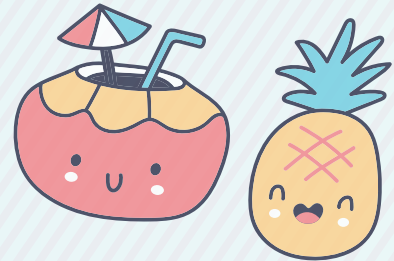
**Incoming Grade 3 and 4 students** for September 2024 should refer to Grade 3-4 programs

\*Referee students should be NEW students to Capstone, and should not have attended any course at Capstone before.

The referred new student\* will receive an instant of \$200 discount when he/she enrolls in an Summer Intensive course.

**Remarks:** *New students can only be referred once. In the event that a new student is referred more than once, only the first person to refer to the new student will be eligible for the rewards under this program. This program is not transferable and is not redeemable for cash. All matters and disputes will be subject to the final decision of Capstone.*

## Enrollment Terms and Conditions for 2024 Summer Courses

1. Registration must be made on the Registration Form provided and returned to us no less than 7 days before the course commencement date with full fee. Payment can be made by cash, EPS, or crossed cheque payable to CAPSTONE PREP EDUCATION CENTER. Cheque payment is accepted subject to clearance. Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.
2. Upon full payment, applications are processed on a first-come-first-served basis. Acceptance is subject to the discretion of Capstone.
3. Please confirm your schedules before enrolling as fees, once paid, are non-refundable and non-transferable. For all classes, if student is absent for a class due to sickness or other personal reasons, no refunds and no make up class will be provided.
4. **NOTE FOR IN-PERSON COURSE:** because of the COVID-19 situation, sessions may sometimes be switched from in-person to online learning due to safety concerns. In such circumstances: **(1)** the student is expected to attend at the same session but through online means, **(2)** tuition will not be adjusted or otherwise compensated for any sessions that were converted from in-person to online due to the above circumstances.
5. A formal assessment is conducted for all new students and former Capstone students (who have not attended any course for the past six months) to ensure he/she will be placed in the class best suited to their learning style and maturity level.
6. A minimum of 4 students are required for a course to run as scheduled. Capstone reserves the right to cancel a course if enrollment is insufficient. In such case, students will be required to transfer to another scheduled course.
7. A Progress Report will be issued to students (with no more than one absent lesson in each enrolled class) no later than 45 days from when the course has ended.
8. Capstone reserves the right to substitute instructors and to make changes to the content and class schedule if necessary without prior notice.
9. Capstone reserves the right to change the terms & conditions without prior notice. In case of any dispute arising from the program, the decision of Capstone shall be final.
10. **NOTE FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER –**
  - a. All classes will be held as scheduled during Typhoon Signal No. 1 or 3 or Amber/Red Warning unless otherwise announced by Capstone.
  - b. Before classes commence, if the Observatory announces that the warning for "Black Rainstorm" is in force or Typhoon Signal No. 8 or higher will be hoisted within two hours, no classes will be held. If these weather signals are lowered during the day, all classes will resume three hours after the official announcement by the HK Observatory. We regret that we cannot arrange replacement classes nor refunds for these enforced closures.
  - c. When Typhoon Signal No. 8 or above is in force during classes, all classes will be dismissed immediately, no replacement classes nor refund will be arranged. When Black Rainstorm warning is in force during classes, all classes will be held as scheduled.
11. Any information we collect from you will be used for student records and other relevant or related purposes by Capstone and its staff for administration, programming and emergencies only. All information will be kept confidential.
12. Capstone may, from time to time, use student photos, videos, or works (including activities inside and outside of classroom) for Capstone course and marketing promotions such as its brochure, website or publications.

### Refund Policies and Procedures

#### A. Refund Policies:

1. In case of school closure prior to the commencement of a course, our school will refund (in full) the course fee collected stated on the tuition invoice.
2. If a course cannot be operated according to the arrangements specified in the fee receipts and students decline the revised arrangements offered by our school, our school will refund in full or on a pro-rata basis of the course fee collected. The request for refund must be through email to [info@capstoneprep.com](mailto:info@capstoneprep.com) and will be processed within a month after the request date.
3. In case of cessation of a course after its commencement, our school will refund the course fee collected on a pro-rata basis as soon as possible and in any event no later than one month after the cessation of the course.

#### B. Refund Procedures:

1. Our School will confirm the refund arrangement either over the telephone or in writing.
2. Our School will refund in accordance with the above policies.
3. When processing the refund, Capstone will not take away the original fee receipts. Acknowledgement on the receipt of the refund must be confirmed by the signature of the parent or legal guardian.

## Novel Study: Clementine by Sara Pennypacker

In this reading comprehension course, students will work together to read a work of fiction and enhance their vocabulary and understanding of various narrative elements. Each lesson will take a close look at the details of a text, allowing for a greater appreciation of the stories we read. In the final lesson, students will test what they have learned by creating a book report for the story.

**In this course, students will ...**

- Test their phonetic abilities by reading new words aloud
- Engage in class discussions and answer plot-related questions to demonstrate their comprehension
- Complete an extended writing task expressing their understanding and opinion in a book report

## Primary Writing

### Informational Writing: Behind the Frame

This summer at Capstone, students will take a deep dive into the lives and styles of various iconic artists. They will engage in discussions about different art pieces, sharing their impressions and attempting to create their own works inspired by them. 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### Narrative Writing: Telling Tall Tales

In this course, students will explore a selection of tall tales and discover the specific narrative techniques that make them so extraordinary. They will read critically and discuss the ways the authors created the characters and plots, and use these same elements in their own writings. Through collaborative discussions, students will share ideas and use descriptive and figurative language in order to write the most fanciful stories possible.

- Study the narrative arc and ensure effective plot planning
- Engage the reader through a wide variety of narrative techniques

## Primary Critical Thinking and Speaking

At the Primary level, our critical thinking programs are designed to gradually expose students to pressing issues around the world. Students begin to speak persuasively about their ideas as well as to consider how they relate to these issues. This summer, we are providing a range of offerings for students who would like to focus on the critical thinking, problem-solving, or public speaking facets of our regular FAST, RAPS, and PSD programs.

### Research and Present: Childhoods Now and Then

This summer, students will put their research skills to the test as they learn what their childhoods would have been like if they were born in ancient Greece or Egypt. Throughout the course, students will conduct interviews, learn how to properly compare and contrast facts they have gathered, and write in informational paragraphs. Additionally, students will also have the chance to develop their public speaking skills and confidently give verbal presentations to show what they have learned.

#### In this course, students will ...

- Broaden their vocabulary and historical knowledge by researching ancient Greece and Egypt
- Investigate and learn new information via interviews and reading
- Present and discuss ideas with clarity and confidence

## Primary Public Speaking and Debate

At the primary level, our public speaking and debate program is designed to equip students with the critical thinking and public speaking skills that give voice and help them advocate for solutions to issues that will affect their futures. Each class devotes itself to either a content or skill focus that will help students speak knowledgeably and persuasively about those issues that matter most to them. This summer, our program offers a diverse selection of issues for students to unpack, ranging from the environment to the economy. **Students interested in joining this intensive program must first complete an interview with our debating instructor.**

## Chess at the Olympics? Choosing the “Right” Sports

Every four years, the top athletes from around the world compete in popular sporting events like the marathon, basketball, and gymnastics. And the Summer Games continue evolving: Olympic organizers regularly add and remove lesser known sports like lacrosse, hot air ballooning, and tug-of-war. What is ultimately recognized as a sport at the Olympics is the subject of great debate! During these times, stakeholders passionately argue why their sport (like chess!) should be kept or added, all the way up until the organizers make their final decision. In this course, students will debate over what constitutes a sport and which ones should be included in or excluded from the world’s most prestigious athletic competition.

### In this course, students will ...

- Further develop their brainstorming and reasoning skills
- Craft solid arguments in support of their position
- Practice defending their claims and identifying flaws in their opponents'
