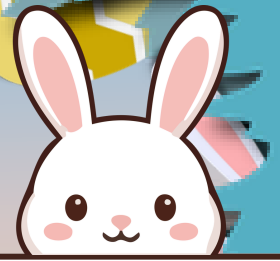

QUICK GUIDELINES

Assessment for New and Returning Students:

New or returning students (who have not attended any course for the past six months) need to be assessed before any enrollment. The purpose of the assessment is to allow our teachers to assess a student's current academic abilities and give their professional recommendations on which programs will be best suited for their needs.

Submit TWO writing samples to receive course recommendations for the Easter program placement. Please refer to the details below:

Primary students - Grade 1 to Grade 6

- Two recent writing samples (one fiction and one non-fiction) that are no older than two months.
- Writing samples should be compositions and not "question and answer" type exercises.

Secondary students - Grade 7 to Grade 12

- Two recent writing samples from different genres (e.g. Persuasive and Descriptive) that are no older than two months.
- Writing samples should be at least 200 words in length.

Comprehensive written assessment is also available. Please contact us for details.

Limited time offer: From now to April 2026, students who completed the comprehensive assessment and enrolled in the Easter Intensive Program will receive the paid assessment fee \$300 as credit for tuition deduction upon enrollment.

Students interested in joining the **G3-12 Easter Debate Program** must also schedule a 15-min online interview with one of our debate instructors.

All discounts are only applicable to students who enroll in our Easter Intensive Program.

Enrollment Terms and Conditions for 2026 Easter Intensive Courses

1. Registration must be made on the Registration Form provided and returned to us no less than 7 days before the course commencement date with full fee. Payment can be made by cash, EPS, or crossed cheque payable to CAPSTONE PREP EDUCATION CENTER. Cheque payment is accepted subject to clearance. Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.
2. Upon full payment, applications are processed on a first-come-first-served basis. Acceptance is subject to the discretion of Capstone.
3. Please confirm your schedules before enrolling as fees, once paid, are non-refundable and non-transferable. For all classes, if a student is absent for a class due to sickness or other personal reasons, no refunds and no make-up class will be provided.
4. A formal assessment is conducted for all new students and former Capstone students (who have not attended any course for the past six months) to ensure he/she will be placed in the class best suited to their learning style and maturity level.
5. A minimum of 4 students are required for a course to run as scheduled. Capstone reserves the right to cancel a course if enrollment is insufficient. In such cases, students will be required to transfer to another scheduled course.
6. A Progress Report will be issued to students (with no more than one absent lesson in each enrolled class) no later than 45 days from when the course has ended.
7. Capstone reserves the right to substitute instructors and to make changes to the content and class schedule if necessary without prior notice.
8. Capstone reserves the right to change the terms & conditions without prior notice. In case of any dispute arising from the program, the decision of Capstone shall be final.
- 9. NOTE FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER –**
 - a. All classes will be held as scheduled during Signal No. 1 or 3 or Amber Alerts or Yellow/Red Warning unless otherwise announced by Capstone.
 - b. Before classes commence, if the Observatory announces that the warning for "Black Rainstorm" is in force or Typhoon Signal No. 8 or higher will be hoisted within 2 hours, no classes will be held. If these weather signals are lowered during the day, all classes will resume three hours after the official announcement by the HK Observatory. We regret that we cannot arrange replacement classes nor refunds for these enforced closures.
 - c. When Typhoon Signal No. 8 or above is in force during classes, all classes will be dismissed immediately, no replacement classes nor refund will be arranged. When Black Rainstorm warning is in force during classes, all classes will be held as scheduled.
10. Any information we collect from you will be used for student records and other relevant or related purposes by Capstone and its staff for administration, programming and emergencies only. All information will be kept confidential.
11. Capstone may, from time to time, use student photos, videos, or works (including activities inside and outside of the classroom) for Capstone course and marketing promotions such as its brochure, website or publications.

Refund Policies and Procedures

A. Refund Policies:

1. In case of school closure prior to the commencement of a course, our school will refund (in full) the course fee collected stated on the tuition invoice.
2. If a course cannot be operated according to the arrangements specified in the fee receipts and students decline the revised arrangements offered by our school, our school will refund in full or on a pro-rata basis of the course fee collected. The request for refund must be through email to info@capstoneprep.com and will be processed within a month after the request date.
3. In case of cessation of a course after its commencement, our school will refund the course fee collected on a pro-rata basis as soon as possible and in any event no later than one month after the cessation of the course.

B. Refund Procedures:

1. Our School will confirm the refund arrangement either over the telephone or in writing.
2. Our School will refund in accordance with the above policies.
3. When processing the refund, Capstone will not take away the original fee receipts. Acknowledgement on the receipt of the refund must be confirmed by the signature of the parent or legal guardian.

At the intermediate level, classes focus on upgrading the fundamentals to a higher level so that students are prepared for more competitive settings. For more advanced students, classes are designed to introduce a higher degree of complexity and nuance to their arguments. These individuals are encouraged to delve deeper into current and global affairs, so they may cultivate a deeper understanding of the world around them. Instructors will closely collaborate with students to develop an engaging and impactful presentation style, while also offering constructive feedback on every speech.

Counter & Conquer: Learning the Art of Rebuttal

Arguments and debates are intense; we are expected to present our best ideas and be able to withstand strong and direct attacks against them with ease. Debates do not have to be tough. With the right tactics and strategies, you too can be a powerful speaker that not only deflects the strongest attacks from the opposition, but tactics and strategies that will equip you to become a powerful speaker and critical thinker. Through numerous tactics and hands-on activities, this course will place students in simulations to sharpen their rebuttal skills and broaden their abilities to weigh and deconstruct ideas. This course is perfect for those with minimal to some experience in debating who are seeking to upgrade their critical thinking and speaking skills.

In this course, students will...

- Learn the methods and tactics that can be used to build coherent argumentation and rebuttals.
- Hone their abilities to critically analyse debate topics and produce high-quality argumentation.
- Engage in general discussions surrounding various social issues that frequently emerge as topics in competitions.
- Engage in competitive debates at the end of each class with extensive and individualised feedback.
